




# **Great Speaker but Small Change to BPS Programme**

We have been fortunate to secure multi award-winning landscape photographer Mark Bauer

to deliver the 2024 Centenary Presentation. However, for logistical reasons we have to move the date of the presentation to February 28<sup>th</sup>. The Members Evening due to be held on that date will now take place on April 10<sup>th</sup>.

Mark is the author of a number of photographic books, including recently updated The Landscape Photography Workshop written with Ross Hoddinott and featured in the latest edition of Digital Camera International Garden Photographer of the Year. With Ross he also runs Dawn2Dusk photography workshops which have been enjoyed by several members.



He specialises in atmospheric images of the South-West and has won multiple awards in prestigious competitions such as the Landscape Photographer of the Year and the International Garden Photographer of the Year.

The talk will be open to visitors with a ticket price of £10 - so do encourage friends and family to join us - but of course it will be free to members.

# **Print Panel Competition**

A reminder that we will be holding our print panel competition on 6<sup>th</sup> March. Members participating will need to enter between five to nine images on a single theme per panel. There is a maximum of two panels per member and they are judged in two classes – standard and advanced. Images do not necessarily have to be mounted in standard 50x40cm mounts. Participants can choose a variety of methods of mounting – including floated images on card - and sizes; even unmounted is possible as members are given a display board on which to present their prints.

For this one competition images do not have to be uploaded into photo entry. However, members should let a committee member know the previous week if they are planning to enter a panel so the appropriate number of display boards can be provided on the evening. Attaching the images to the boards will be the responsibility of the member.
